RESEARCH

Most of my research is devoted to understanding how we use language to convey meaning. I have focused on understanding the logical scaffolding of languages as expressed in function terms such as ‘and’, ‘if’, ‘or’, and ‘the’, as well as pronouns and quantifiers. These words provide clues as to what kind of formal models we can use to capture linguistic meaning. In this work, I use methods from and address research questions in logic, game theory, linguistics, and psychology. My main other area of research is formal epistemology, an area where probability theory and logic are used to address classic philosophical questions about belief and knowledge.

GRANTS

I have received over £300,000 in grants from the AHRC as a PI and co-I for projects focused on studying meaning in natural language.

PUBLICATIONS

26 published or forthcoming articles and book chapters, including 16 in top-rated, peer-reviewed journals in general philosophy (e.g. *Noûs*), logic (e.g. *Journal of Philosophical Logic*), and semantics (e.g. *Semantics & Pragmatics*). My work, as of 5/2019, has over 670 google scholar citations (h-index 15, i10-index 18).

TALKS

I have been invited to give over 60 talks at universities such as Berkeley, Chicago, École Normale Supérieure, Edinburgh, MIT, Oxford, NYU and Yale and I have given keynote addresses at international conferences such as the biennial *Amsterdam Colloquium*.

TEACHING

I have taught a variety of undergraduate and graduate courses on logic, the philosophy of language, cognitive science, linguistic semantics and formal epistemology at Columbia, Yale, Oxford, and UCL. I have also two taught short courses at interational summer schools. Postgraduate students whose work I have supervised now have positions at Cambridge, Michigan, and Princeton.

ACADEMIC SERVICE

I have served as an associate editor of *Mind* and *Journal of Semantics*, and serve on the editorial board of *The Journal of Philosophy*. I have organized several major international conferences and workshops in Oxford, Berlin and London on topics in philosophy of language, linguistic semantics, and epistemology. I have served as a referee for over 30 journals and conferences across philosophy and linguistics.

HONORARY APPOINTMENT

I am ‘£50 fellow’ of All Souls College, Oxford, where I serve on the governing body.
